Sunday 26 October

- **Moderator** | Today, the Moderator will be taking services in Ballinderry (harvest) and then in Maze, whose minister is the Very Rev Dr William Henry. Pray for the services & that there might be a particular sense of gratitude for all God's provision in this season of harvest.
- Worship: Respond to God | My sacrifice, O God, is a broken spirit; a broken and contrite heart you, God, will not despise. Psalm 51:17. Give thanks that God accepts us as we come humbly before him and ask that experiencing his presence in worship today might better shape our hearts to live for him.

Monday 27 October

- Csaba & Ilona Veres, global mission workers, Hungary | Give thanks for answered prayer, that the purchase of the property for the church plant in Bodaszőlő is able to proceed, and for all those who have so generously donated towards its purchase and renovation. Pray for the work on the building as it gets under way and remember Csaba and Ilona, that they would know God's wisdom and guidance in all that they do.
- The Presbyterian Church of Pakistan (PCP) Pakistan | Pray for the 250 Christian families across five villages in the Narowal district of Punjab who have been severely impacted by the 2025 monsoon floods their homes, livelihoods, and food stocks having been destroyed, pushing them into a critical state of food insecurity. Pray for the PCP as it endeavours to provide relief to those most deeply impacted.
